Monday

Read for 30 minutes every day!	
Math	Create and complete a doubles fact scavenger hunt! You will need: Post-its or paper and tape and a pencil. Write all the doubles facts 1-12 on separate post-its. For example, on one post-it, write $1 + 1 = \underline{\quad}$. On the next post-it, write $2 + 2 = \underline{\quad}$. Have a family member hide all the math facts around the house. Then go find all of the doubles facts. Solve as you collect! To extend this activity, you can do your doubles plus one facts too ($5 + 6 = \underline{\quad}$).
Literacy	Spelling- On a sheet of paper, copy down this list of words. Write each word a total five times and create a sentence using each spelling word. CHALLENGE: Your sentences have to be about your teachers, your classmates, your family, or your favorite book character! To extend this activity, you can divide a paper into three columns and sort your words under a, a_e, or ai. <i>Chat, nap, wag, shack, whale, same, grape, chase, wave, mail, train, snail, tail, brain, paid</i>
Art	Use your toys and items around your home to recreate a picture from one of your favorite picture books.
PE	See how long you can balance on your right foot. Then see how long you can balance on your left foot. Which foot were you able to balance on longer?

Tuesday

Read for 30 minutes every day!																	
Math	Fishing for Tens! You will need a deck of cards. If you don't have cards, you can write numbers 1-9 on pieces of paper. You will need 4 of each number. So four 1's, four 2's ect. If you are using a deck of cards, remove the tens, jacks, queens, and kings from the deck. (aces=1). Deal each player five cards. As in Go Fish, the object is for players to make pairs, but instead of matching, the sum of the two cards must equal 10. Players take turns asking other players for cards that would make 10 when added to another card in their hand. If a player requests a card that no one has, he has to "go fish" and pick a new card from the deck. If a player runs out of cards, he picks two new cards. The game ends when there are no more cards in the pile. Players show their pairs and check each other's math. The player with the most sums of 10 wins.																
Literacy	<p>On a sheet of paper, write a "How-To" paragraph. For example, "How to make a PB & J Sandwich" or "How I Get Ready For Bed". Remember to use transitional words and not label step 1, step 2 ect. Think about each step and be sure to re-read your work. Art	Find pictures of people in a newspaper, advertise, packaging, or magazine and draw silly hats on their heads.																
PE	Do 20 Jumping Jacks																

Wednesday

Read for 30 minutes every day!	
Math	Shaving equations! You will need a dollop of shaving cream or you can write with a pencil and paper if you don't feel like getting messy. Spread the shaving cream on the table. Using your finger, write a two-digit or three-digit addition problem. Solve the problem and then write the related subtraction sentence. For example, $28 + 27 = 55$. The related subtraction sentence is $55 - 28 = 27$. Use your hand to erase. Repeat this process with 10 - 15 other problems. Don't forget to clean the table when you're done!
Literacy	Nouns- Make a 4 column chart with the titles "Person," "Place," "Thing," or "Idea." Set a timer to five minutes. Write as many nouns that you can think of. They can also be items you see around your home. Share your lists with your teacher. The longest fully-correct list gets to choose the theme for our next video meeting!
Art	Go on a 3-D Shape Hunt for cylinders, cubes, pyramids, spheres, and rectangular solids. Trace the shapes on a piece of paper to make a 2-D design then, color on the shapes.
PE	Do 20 Sit ups

Math	Skip Count to 100 by 2s, 5s, and 10s forward and backwards. Write them down on a separate piece of paper.
Literacy	Character Traits- Draw a spring flower. In the middle(stigma) write your name. On the petals write character traits that describe yourself. Color and make it beautiful, feel free to add a background. Snap a picture and send it to your teacher. To extend this activity, on the back write a paragraph explaining why you choose each character trait. Remember a paragraph is 5 sentences!
Art	Draw a funny robot using all 6 types of lines: Vertical, horizontal, diagonal, curvy, zig-zag, and spiral.
PE	Using a high-quality sentence, write down your favorite sport and why it is your favorite sport. Then go act out the sport to someone and see if they can guess it!
