Monday:

- Read with a hat on for 30 minutes.
- Math: How many fingers and toes are in your house? Did you count pets' toes too?
- Literacy: Read your favorite book in your book bag and retell your favorite part.
- Writing: Write a story using (first, next, then, last) about what you did over the weekend.
- Expedition: Draw a picture of you living in your habitat. Label all of the things you need to survive and color your picture.
- PE- Practice the different **pathways** (Zig Zag, Straight, Curved) while galloping (cat chases the mouse)
- Art- Draw a picture of your favorite dessert and add visual texture to help make it look delicious!

Tuesday:

- Read to your favorite toy for 30 minutes.
- Math: Look out your window and find as many shapes as you can. Play "I Spy" and describe the shapes you see.
- Literacy: Look around your house, find 6 different objects and write all the sounds you hear and draw a picture to match.
- Writing: Write a story with a topic sentence, facts and a closing sentence teaching me how to make your favorite food.
- Expedition: Draw a picture of an animal living in an arctic habitat and label all of the things they need to survive, color your picture.

- PE- Find a book to read, then find a word that repeats often in the book. Every time you read that word do one jumping jack.
- Art- Cut out strips of colored paper or any other paper you have, then fold, curl and bend them. Glue the ends of the paper strips down on another flat piece of paper so that the middle of the strips stand up on their own. You can glue paper strips together to build complex designs and make your own paper playground. Here are some suggestions: Curl a strip of paper to make a slide or fold a strip like a paper fan, back and forth, to make steps!

#### Wednesday:

- Read in a secret spot for 30 minutes.
- Math: Make a tower of objects(Legos, blocks, cans). Break it into two parts. How many are in each? How many altogether?
- Literacy: Think about your favorite fiction book we read in class and tell someone or draw a picture of the problem and solution in the story.
- Writing: Write a story using (first, next, then, last) about your first day of school.
- Expedition: Draw a picture of an animal living in an ocean habitat and label all of the things they need to survive, color your picture.
- PE- FREEZE Dance! Have someone play music, every time they pause the music you must freeze as quickly as possible and stay frozen until the music turns back on.
- Art- Draw yourself as a superhero! Write down your superpowers and abilities on the back of your drawing. Bonus: Draw your family as superheroes and give your mighty team an awesome heroic name! Here are some examples of super-team names: The Incredibles, The Fantastic Four, The Avengers, The Super Friends, and The Justice League.

#### Thursday:

- Read next to a window for 30 minutes.
- Math:Count how many doorknobs in your house. Count how many windows. Which has less? Which has more?
- Literacy: If you can do the sight word workout video (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=z2yUk3hVOpU>) or use your sight word ring from your book bag and write 1-3 sentences using some of your sight words.
- Writing: Write a story with a topic sentence, facts and a closing sentence teaching me about your favorite thing to do at school.
- Expedition: Draw a picture of an animal living in a grassland habitat and label all of the things they need to survive, color your picture.
- PE- Crab walk around the house for 10 minutes. See if anyone wants to race you!

- Art- Sort your toys into groups of warm colors and cool colors. Which group has more in it? Warm colors remind us of warm things like the sun and fire, spicy things like chili peppers and cinnamon candies. Cool colors remind us of leafy plants, clean water and frosty ice, and grape jelly.

Friday:

- Pretend you are your teacher and read to your class for 30 minutes.
- Math: Draw a picture using only triangles, rectangles, and circles. How many of each did you use?
- Literacy: Go through your book bag and put your books into two piles: informational and Fiction and tell someone how you know. Do not worry if you don't have any informational books you can still explain to someone how you know a book is informational.
- Writing: Collect all of your writings throughout the whole week and read them to a member in your family, go through and check all your work. Make sure to send a picture of your favorite writing to your teacher!
- Expedition: Draw a picture of an animal living in a rainforest habitat and label all of the things they need to survive, color your picture.
- PE- Balance on one foot while saying the ABC's. See if you can balance for all 26 letters!
- Art- Make a thank you card for someone in your home that you really appreciate and has done something nice or helpful for you this week. If you are having trouble deciding on just one person, make a card for everyone in your home this weekend! Use your neatest handwriting and cleanest coloring to tell someone special how much you appreciate them!
