Monday:

- **Sight Word Challenge: Words to study: yes, then, come, said, out, our, four, girl, one, for.** Go through your old cards and take out the ones you need for this week. Write your new words down on a piece of paper or index card and add them to your old cards. Have someone in your family help you study these words so you can complete the daily challenges and become a sight word champion!
- **Humanities: Before reading think about:** *Have you ever lost a tooth? How did you feel when you lost your tooth?* Go to Epic and read [Scaredy Monster Loses a Tooth](#) (don't forget to take the quiz at the end)
- **Math: Warm up:** Today you are going to look for something in your house that is taller than you. How much taller is it? Is it much taller than you or a little bit taller than you? Now go on Happy Numbers for 20 minutes to do your daily math learning.
- **Expedition:** [Watch this video](#). Think about what a coral reef habitat looks like. Where can you find a coral reef? What lives in a coral reef habitat? Draw a picture of your own coral reef habitat or tell someone all about it.
- **Writing:** Pretend you just took a trip to the moon. Write to teach me all about it! How did you get there? What did you see there? Did you go by yourself? Was it really fun, why or why not? Was it a little scary, why or why not?
- **PE:** Do 20 arm circles forwards, then do 20 arm circles backwards!

- **Art:** Gather and arrange your toys, or other safe items around your home, on a sheet of paper. The paper is like a pedestal for your toys -- they all have to fit on the paper. Take a walk around your arrangement, find the most interesting view, and make a pencil drawing of what you see.

Tuesday:

- **Sight Word Challenge: Sight word Smash Up!** Choose someone in your family to play with you. Spread your sight word cards down on the floor (face up) and grab a small soft bean bag or stuffed animal. Have them say a sight word and you have to try to throw it on that card. Now it's your turn you call out the sight words and see if someone in your family can land it on the sight word. If it is a nice day you can do this outside with chalk.
- **Humanities: Before reading think about:** *Do you have a pet? Do you want a pet?*
Go to Epic and read: [Pete the Cat: A Pet for Pete](#) (don't forget to take the quiz at the end)
- **Math: Warm up:** Find something in your house that is shorter than you. How many of those things would you need to line up to be as tall as you? When you're done, go on Happy Numbers for 20 minutes to do your daily math learning.
- **Expedition:** [Watch this video.](#) Think about how a fish might camouflage itself in a coral reef. Why do they need to camouflage? What kinds of colors would you see? Draw a picture of a fish camouflaged in the coral reef or tell someone all about it.
- **Writing:** We are almost done with Kindergarten, friends! That means your teacher will have a bunch of new Kindergarteners next year, while you go to 1st grade. Write a letter to an incoming Kindergartner to tell them your favorite parts about being in Kindergarten. What did you like best? What was maybe hard at first but then got a little easier? What is your favorite thing we learned about in school? (Families, please save this if you can!)
- **PE:** Challenge a family member or friend to see who can do more star jumps!
- **Art:** Find a piece of furniture in your home to draw without looking at your paper. Focus on the different parts of the furniture, follow the shapes and edges of the item as you move your pencil across the paper. Try not to look at your drawing until

you feel like you have finished drawing all the parts of your chosen piece of furniture.

Wednesday:

- **Sight Word Challenge: Sight word hide and seek!** Give your cards to a grown-up and close your eyes while they hide the cards around your home. (If it is nice out, you might do this outside!) They will let you know when it is okay for you to look for them. When you find a card, you must take it to your grown-up. If you can read the word, you can keep the card. If you cannot read the word, your grown-up keeps the card. How many cards did you keep?
- **Humanities: Before reading think about:** *Have you ever really, really wanted something?* Go to Epic and read: [But I Want It](#) (don't forget the quiz at the end)
- **Math: Warm up:** Look around your house and find something that is heavy. How heavy is it? Can you lift it, or is it so heavy you need help? When you're done, go on Happy Numbers for 20 minutes to do your daily math learning.
- **Expedition:** [Watch this video.](#) Look and listen to how a shark in the coral reef gets its food. What does the shark eat? Is it a carnivore, an omnivore, or a herbivore? Draw a food chain including the shark, a big fish, and a little fish, or tell someone about it. Remember, animals that get eaten are on the bottom, the animal that eats the others is at the top!
- **Writing:** Write a letter to your hero. Maybe this is your favorite sports player, maybe it's a character in a movie, maybe it's someone you know in real life (a teacher, your parent, a family member or friend). Tell them why they are your hero and what makes them so special to you. Give them the letter if you can!
- **PE:** Play The Floor is Lava and create a course from one side of the room to the other without touching the floor!
- **Art:** Completely color in a sheet of paper with your pencil. Try using the side of your sharpened pencil instead of the point. Choose one of your stuffed animals, toys, or other safe items in your home to draw. Use an eraser to draw your item. What happens when you lightly erase the pencil marks as opposed to pushing down harder?

Thursday:

- **Sight Word Challenge: Colorful Sight Words!** Today you have an option: you can rainbow write your sight words or build them using playdough. If it's nice out go outside and you can make a sight word hopscotch. Be sure to send pictures or videos of what you do to your teacher.
- **Humanities: Before reading think about:** *Do you know why we wash our hands? Do you know how we spread germs?* Go to Epic and read: [Sid the Science Kid: The Trouble With Germs](#) (don't forget to take the quiz at the end)
- **Math: Warm up:** Look around your house and find something that is light. Is it so light you can pick it up with just one hand? When you are done, go on Happy Numbers for 20 minutes to do your daily math learning.
- **Expedition:** [Watch this video.](#) Look and listen for where an eel finds shelter in a coral reef. What does it use its shelter for? Draw a picture of an eel in its shelter or tell someone about it.
- **Writing:** Pick three of your sight words from this week and use each one in a sentence. Don't forget finger spaces, capital letters and periods!
- **PE:** Grab a balloon, rolled up sock, or ball. See how many times you can strike the object up in a row without letting it hit the floor!
- **Art:** Find a natural object outside, like a leaf, rock, flower, or shell to draw today. Fold a piece of paper in half vertically and horizontally to make four boxes. Before you begin drawing, get a watch, timer, or ask someone else at home to time you for this activity. In the first box, you will draw your item for only 15 seconds. In the second box, try to draw the item again for 30 seconds. In the third box, you will have 1 minute to draw your item. When the time is up, drop that pencil! In the last box, try to draw your item from memory, without looking at it. This last drawing has no time limit. Which one of the drawings do you like best?

Friday:

- **Sight Word Quiz: Will You Be A Sight Word Champion?** Study your words and make sure you are ready! Your teacher will give you your sight word quiz on Zoom, by phone, or on FaceTime!
- **Humanities: Before reading think about:** *Do you know the story of the 3 Little Pigs? Have you ever recycled anything?* Go to Epic and read: [The Three Little Recyclers](#) (don't forget the quiz at the end)
- **Math: Warm up:** Today look for people in your house that are taller than you. Then look for people that are shorter than you. Are there more people that are taller than you or shorter than you in your house? Now you can go on Happy Numbers for 20 minutes to do your daily math learning.
- **Expedition:** [Watch this video](#). Look and listen for what a sea turtle's habitat looks like. What does it feel like? What does it look like? Draw a picture of a sea turtle in its habitat or tell someone all about it.
- **Writing:** Pretend you just found a treasure map. Write to tell me what you would do next. Do you go look for the treasure? Will you have anyone help you? What tools do you need? If you found the treasure, what is it? What do you do with your treasure?
- **PE:** Have a dance party for 15 minutes!
- **Art:** Choose a favorite toy or stuffed animal to draw today. Set up your toy or stuffed animal in a space in which you can walk all the way around the toy and clearly see it. Choose three different colored markers, crayons, or colored pencils to draw with today. Pick a viewpoint to draw your toy, and one color to draw what you see. When you are done with the first drawing, move to a new spot around your toy two times and use a different color each time to draw what you see from these new perspectives. For an extra design challenge, try to overlap the different drawings, making a new drawing of your toy on top of the drawing you just made in a different color.
